## Roast Vegetable and Fetta Pie

Serves 4



### Ingredients

1 x 400g sheet shortcrust or wholemeal pastry  
3 cups cooked, roasted vegetables  
3 roma tomatoes, quartered  
2 garlic cloves, crushed  
60ml (1/4 cup) olive oil  
2 tsp chopped fresh rosemary  
125g feta, cubed  
2 tbs grated parmesan  
Green salad to serve

### Method

1. Preheat oven to 180°C. Lightly grease a 23cm pie plate.
2. Lay the pastry into the plate, line with baking paper and rice and blind bake for 10 minutes. Remove the paper and rice and bake for a further five minutes.
3. Toss all vegetables with the garlic, oil and rosemary, then fill the pastry case. Dot with feta and sprinkle with parmesan. Bake for 20 minutes. Serve with a green salad.
